Making Way for Fish and Wildlife

Margen Carlson, Habitat Program Director, and Chris Conklin, Habitat Program Deputy Director

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These are exciting times to think big about how concrete could be part of the solution to make way for fish and wildlife. Washington is thinking hard about how to make sure fish and wildlife can move more freely across the landscape, even as we improve transportation infrastructure and as conditions change over time. We'll highlight a few big issues, like water crossing structures that can pass water or mudflows, creating wildlife over- and under-passes, and relocating roads as part of habitat restoration projects, where concrete structures could be part of turning the issue into an opportunity for industry and the public.



Margen Carlson is the Habitat Program Director of the Department of Fish and Wildlife, providing vision and direction for staff and operations in Olympia and throughout Washington. Margen has worked for the Department for nearly 18 years and has had the opportunity to work on a variety of conservation issues including salmon and recovery, maintaining habitat connectivity in developed areas, and marine nearshore protection and restoration in Puget Sound. She is passionate about collaborative and creative conservation approaches, and helping her teams and partners to be successful. Margen explores the outdoors with her husband and young daughter in Olympia, WA, and beyond.



Chris Conklin is the Habitat Program Deputy Director for the Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW). Chris is a born and raised Washingtonian, minus the years spent earning his Bachelor's Degree in Fisheries Resources from the University of Idaho as well as working for the Forest Service in North Idaho. He returned to Washington to work for the Quinalt Indian Nation and the Department of Natural Resources before finding a home at the WDFW in 2013. Oregon Dept. of Transportation Approved Manufacturers of Precast Structures

This presentation plans to discuss the requirements and steps for a precast manufacturer to be placed on Oregon Dept of Transportations Approved Manufacturer List in the Non-field Tested Materials Acceptance Guide. Personnel, labs, materials, mix design certifications and/or approvals as well as a working QC Plan will be discussed. These listings in the Non-field Tested Materials Acceptance Guide provide contractors with “one stop shopping” to find approved precasters for structures required in their ODOT contract. These structures include Manholes/Catch Basins/Inlets, Sound Walls, Concrete Barrier, and Concrete Pipe.



Krag Kanoff works as the Structure Services Coordinator and Underwater Inspection for ODOT. He has worked for ODOT for the past 20 years. Prior to his services for ODOT, he worked for Emery & Sons Construction in Stayton, Oregon, in the Underground Utility and Excavation Work department.
